JOB PURPOSE

The Isle of Man Cricket Association (IOMCA) are looking to appoint an outstanding individual to drive the continued growth of the women's and girls' game on the Isle of Man.

The IOMCA are the governing body for cricket on the Isle of Man responsible for the growth and development of all Cricket. In line with International Cricket Council (ICC) strategy and our own 'Future of Cricket' strategy, the IOMCA continues to offer and develop cricket opportunities for all, as we aim to make Cricket a game for all.

We are looking to recruit a highly motivated and enthusiastic individual with a passion for Cricket at all levels, who is looking to learn and develop their skills as cricket coach. The role will include helping to develop and deliver new initiatives through to coaching and developing players within a National team structure.

This person will become an integral part of the IOMCA Development team, working alongside the Cricket Development Officer, to lead the continual development and growth of Women's and Girls Cricket throughout the Island.

The post holder must always ensure that the IOMCA Safeguarding Policy Guidelines are observed and upheld by all stakeholders in Isle of Man ("IOM") cricket.

Main responsibilities and duties

1. **Acting as the Lead for the IOMCA development team in working with schools, clubs, and any other opportunities to grow levels of participation in cricket for Women and Girl's.**
2. Facilitate and support the development of the club/school link initiative as part of the delivery of the IOMCA strategy.
3. Responsible for the promotion and delivery of high-quality cricket in primary and secondary schools.

4. Supporting Manx Sport and Recreation (“MSR”) initiatives including Manx Youth Games and Community Games.
5. Assisting and supporting developing junior cricket.
6. Assisting in the delivery of the IOMCA high performance/development programmes.
7. Assisting in the delivery of the skills development programmes.
8. Developing strong relationships with volunteers, coaches, school staff and club officials.
9. Maintaining consistent communication between schools and other bodies involved in the governance and delivery of junior cricket for boys and girls.
10. Updating the IOMCA social media accounts including Website and Facebook.
11. Communicating positively with all stakeholders, players, coaches, schools, clubs, teachers, and parents.

- Ability to manage yourself effectively, manages competing priorities and escalates issues when required
